Highlights from the November Meeting:

The meeting was called to order at 7:21. Two new hams were introduced and welcomed. Self-introductions were completed. There were 55 in attendance.

Next, Dave Spoelstra, N9KT, gave his presentation on logging programs. He concentrated on the N1MM contest logging program. This program is necessary for all contest operators. Even if you are a "search and pounce" type operator and do not do many contest this program is of great assistance.

One of the main reasons for using N1MM is checking for duplicates and eliminating calling someone a second time. The program works for over 300 ham contests and also works for the Indiana QSO party. It sets the screen up on your computer to provide the proper entry blocks for each contest. There are many possible screen windows to bring up and used for various purposes in helping you with your score for contest. Using CAT Control on your rig you can have your frequency and everything entered in your logging program directly. The function key can be used for sending CQ's and answering contest reports in CW and SSB making contesting very easy, and saving your voice during long contest.

To get this free program go to <u>http://n1mm.hamdocs.com/</u>, and find the main program selection. Also look for "N1MM QUICK GUIDE", this is an excellent help file and should be read before installing the program. Note: Be sure and install "LATEST UP-DATES" before opening program the first time.

Free digital program: HAM RADIO DELUXE is a very popular program and is available at <u>http://www.ham-radio-deluxe.com/</u>. This program operates all the digital modes and has a great logging program included. These great FREE software programs will help you update your station and have a lot of fun on ham radio.

After Dave's presentation, it was announced that the club's present officers will serve another year. The 2011 Field Day results were announced. The club's station, W9JP,

came in first in Indiana, 13th nationally. Door prizes were given away, and the meeting adjourned at 8:47 pm.

Ham Radio News:

60 METER BAND CHANGES APPROVED

FCC Docket number 10-98 was released on Friday, November 18, affecting the amateur radio use of the 60 meter (5 MHz) band. There are still 5 "channelized" frequencies. However, one of the frequencies has been replace with a new one:

5330.5 kHz USB (center of channel = 5332.0)

5346.5 kHz USB (center of channel = 5348.0)

5357.0 kHz USB (center of channel = 5358.5) New, replacing 5366.5 USB

5371.5 kHz USB (center of channel = 5373.0)

5403.5 kHz USB (center of channel = 5405.0)

The maximum allowed power level is now 100Watts PEP (ERP) effective radiated power referenced to a dipole. If another type of antenna is used, the station licensee must maintain a record of either the antenna manufacturer's data on the antenna gain or calculations of the antenna gain.

Upper Side Band Phone, Data, or RTTY transmissions may use dial (VFO) USB suppressed carrier frequency at 1.5kHz below the center of the channel.

Transmissions must not exceed the 2.8kHz bandwidth channel.

RTTY modes such as PSK31 must not exceed 60Hz necessary bandwidth. Data modes must not exceed 2.8kHz bandwidth.

CW bandwidth must not exceed 150Hz bandwidth and the CW frequency should be at the center of the channel.

Data stations operating under section § 97.221 automatically controlled digital station, are not allowed on these 5MHz channels.

INDIANA TRAFFIC NET CHANGE

On November 14, the ITN moved to 6 p.m. E.S.T. with a new frequency of 3.900 Mhz.

Hopefully, this will allow more individuals to check in after they get off work and the frequency change will eliminate any interference from east coast hams that use the 3.910 frequency. Net Controls and Alternate Net Controls are always needed for the different nets, whether they are a Section Net such as the ITN and QIN, or local nets. Consider volunteering for a Net Control position for one session, either morning or evening, on the Section Nets, and volunteer to cover a local net once in awhile.

POSTAGE RATES GOING UP

Effective January 22, 2012, US Postal Rates will increase as follows:

- ▲ First Class letters (up to 1 ounce): 1-cent increase to 45 cents.
- ▲ Additional ounces: unchanged at 20 cents each.
- ▲ Postcards: 3 cent increase to 32 cents.
- ▲ Up to one ounce letters to Canada and Mexico: 5 cent increase to 85 cents.
- ▲ Letters to other international destinations: 7 cent increase to \$1.05.
