Following are some notes provided by Jim Rinehart, K9RU, from the club's annual Christmas Dinner, held at Primo Banquet Hall:

"Ann Luther gave a presentation at the IRC Christmas meeting about her trip to Tanzania as part of an American group climbing Mt Kilimanjaro. Tanzania is the 13th largest country in Africa.

She described their hotel accommodations (restroom facilities), food, transportation systems, electric and water supply and resources in the different cities the group visited. Everything sounded pretty primitive and with only the basics available. Electricity and water were in short supply. Kilimanjaro sounded like a challenge to climb.

She went over the preparation they did to climb the 19 thousand feet Kilimanjaro, the support they received from the people arranging the climb, the primitive conditions and the risk involved. She compared it with their trip to Peru and climbing Machu Pikchu.

Ann Luther was a great speaker, with a lot of interesting details about the places she visited with her husband and the American group she traveled with and climbing Mt Kilimanjaro.

A lot of people stayed after the meeting to talk with her.

HAMVENTION PLANNERS WORKING ON TRAFFIC FLOW

Tim Duffy, K3LR, of DX Engineering, interviewed Mike Kalter, W8CI, treasurer of the Dayton Amateur Radio Association, sponsors of the Hamvention. Following is an excerpt from that interview. “We recognized that we needed to reach out to a professional engineering firm that does this [traffic planning] all over the country to help us to work with the local government officials, so that we can have a good solid plan to keep the people flowing in,” Kalter told Duffy.

Kalter said arrangements have been made to have staging areas for those needing to either offload or load equipment from the indoor exhibit areas or the flea market.

He also pointed out that on-site parking would be free, and that no one will have to park in the mud. Kalter said areas set aside for parking are well drained, and he doesn't anticipate any problems, even if it rains during Hamvention. That goes for the flea market

area as well, he said, noting that the arena infield area gets used events in good and bad weather alike.

Kalter said Hamvention expects to be able to post the plan for flea market spaces on its website soon. The layout for indoor vendor and exhibitor booths is already available on the Hamvention website. Kalter said that if everyone who attended Hamvention 2016 at Hara Arena shows up again this year, they will find plenty of room at the new venue. Maps are available on the website.

AWARD NOMINEES DUE FOR 2017 HAMVENTION

The 2017 Hamvention® Awards Committee, chaired by Frank J. Beafore, WS8B, has announced that nominations are open for 2017 awards, sometimes considered the Academy Awards of Amateur Radio. The program will bestow awards for Amateur of the Year, Technical Achievement, Special Achievement, and Club of the Year.

“The Hamvention Awards event has been held since 1955,” a Hamvention news release said. “Over these years, many amateurs have been honored for their dedication and selfless contributions to our avocation and to mankind.” Nominees are invited for these awards.

Effective Sunday, January 22, the rate for a 1 ounce First-Class Mail Letter will increase to \$0.49 (from \$0.47). Additional ounces for domestic mail will remain at \$0.21 per ounce, and international letters will remain at \$1.15.

NATIONAL PARKS ON THE AIR CONTACTS TOP 1 MILLION!

Participants in ARRL's National Parks on the Air (NPOTA) program completed more than 1 million contacts! Activators operating from National Park Service units across the US and Chasers around the world pushed the contact tally over its goal in December. ARRL sponsored NPOTA to help the National Park Service celebrate its centennial.

"National Parks on the Air has become one of the most popular events in the history of

the League," NPOTA Administrator Sean Kutzko, KX9X, said. "It's been fun seeing so many hams take part."

Kutzko said NPOTA garnered interest from hams at all proficiency levels, but he was especially gratified to see how it encouraged less-experienced hams to acquire new skills, such as operating a portable station on battery power, learning CW, or discovering digital modes. "Pileups from some activations rivaled those during a major DXpedition -- if only for a few hours at a time," he added.
