Highlights from the April Meeting:

The meeting was called to order at 7:32 by Club President, David Spoelstra, N9KT. There were around 40 in attendance.

Jim Rinehart, K9RU, showed some pictures of video and AM gear of a former (1960's) ham. Jim also talked about the auction this year. This year, sellers will be able to set reserves for nicer items. Anyone that has nicer items for the auction is asked to email pictures and description to k9ru@arrl.net so the information can be posted to the club's website. Jim also reminded those in attendance that the Indiana QSO Party is coming up May 6, running from 11:00 am to 11:00 pm, local time. Jim asked that folks send log with Indpls Radio Club as your club. Jim also volunteered to compile paper logs if folks don't have too many entries. Logs can be sent to the same email address.

David, N9KT, reminded folks of the Dayton (Xenia) Hamvention bus trip on May 20. The cost is the same as last year, \$30 per person. This only covers the cost of the bus trip. Contact Rhonda Curtis, WS9H, for bus tickets.

Jace Thompson, KD9BIG, talked about Field Day, coming up June 24 and 25.

Mike Palmer, N9FEB, talked about the Mini-Marathon coming up on May 6. He still needs 10 more volunteers. Contact Mike at <u>n9feb@comcast.net</u> if you are interested in helping out. Mike said he has enough volunteers for the 500 Festival Parade. Mike said there are 5 or 6 more events coming up later that will need radio volunteers.

K9RU also said that he and Jace have been working on the Ivy Tech/Indianapolis Radio Club station. They are still working on some remote issues. Contact Jim or Jace if you are interested in operating the station.

David recognized 3 new members that were present. There was one new ham present: Peggy Webb, W9PLW.

Next, David introduced the featured speaker for the evening, Brent Walls, N9BA, Indiana Section Manager.

Brent talked about the ARRL Official Observer Program. The program has been around for over 80 years in one way or another. It is also known as the amateur auxiliary. There are over 700 volunteer Official Observers nationwide. OOs have no enforcement power. They are in place to help amateurs be better operators, t try to help in the understanding of FCC rules and compliance, and supporting the self regulation of amateurs. OOs enhance the opportunity for amateurs to contribute to the community. Also OOs help the FCC to better utilize their limited resources. Official Observers are ARRL appointments through Field Organization. They are the eyes and ears of the FCC. OOs help identify potential problems, and send out advisory notices for potential problems. They also send out good operator reports and help coordinate Local Interference Committees as needed. OOs are not "radio police". They have no enforcement powers, they are only advisors to the FCC. There is an ARRL training program for OOs, as well as an ARRL Handbook for Radio Communications. Official Observers must take an exam to be certified by the ARRL. Brent said there are changes coming to the OO program. A new MOU is being formed between ARRL and FCC that is being brought about by staff reductions at the FCC. The new program is supposed to streamline information exchange between the ARRL and FCC. Currently in IN there are 11 OOs appointed. There is currently no published listing of OOs in IN. In order to be an OO, an amateur needs to be licensed for at least 4 years, and hold at least a Technician licensee. The ARRL doesn't have a "code of conduct" per se. Brent encouraged those present to "mentor" folks that may be not using proper procedures, etc.

After David thanked Brent for his informative talk, Jay, W9TC, talked about Field Day operation. Jay said that last year we had to import operators from other clubs. Tom Price, WB9UNG, announced that he is going to be moving soon, and has several oscilloscopes, and is willing to give them to anyone that will give them a good home. K9RU reminded those in attendance that Radar has information on the web site about gear that the club is selling. Radar reminded folks to send text files for import to the web site. David reminded those in attendance to remember the club in their final arrangements.

Next month's meeting is on Antique Radios. One final reminder that the W9IMS Special Event stations start up next month. Contact David if interested in operating.
