Highlights from the January Meeting:

The meeting was called to order via Zoom at 7:30 pm by Club President David Spoelstra, N9KT. There were 48 in attendance. David recognized the passing of Bob Begeman, W9KVK, who died at the age of 100 on Christmas Day *[see more information in this newsletter]*. David talked about the successful Holiday pitch-in. The IRC is once again teaming up with the SATERN group for Winter Field Day on January 25, getting together at 2:00 at the EDS Facility *[see more information in this newsletter]*. David announced that he and Jim Rinehart, K9RU will be hosting a one day Technician class and test session on March 15 at the EDS Facility. Watch your email for more information and sign up. K9RU announced that the club's VE team needs more VEs. Contact Jim at k9ru@arrl.net if you're interested in becoming a VE, especially if you hold an Extra class license. David announced that we will start having a table available at in-person meetings for members to offer ham radio related items for sale.

Next David introduced the evening's presenter, Eric Swartz, WA6HHQ of Elecraft. Eric started off with how Elecraft came to be. A "precursor" of Elecraft was the NorCal 40 transceiver designed and built by Wayne Burdick, N6KR in 1994. Elecraft officially

began in 1998 when Wayne and Eric decided to concentrate on high performance, yet portable radios in both fully assembled and kit versions. The first model shipped by Elecraft in 1999 was the K2 in kit form. Eric talked about the various radio models and accessories that have been offered since the K2. They have typically offered an “ultra-portable” version of each model, with a smaller form factor and lower power output, such as the KX2 and KX3 models to accompany their full size and power companions, the K2 and K3. The P3 panadapter display offered K3 users a visual “waterfall” spectral display. They updated the K3 with the K3S model and their current model is the K4 line, a full direct sampling SDR based radio that incorporates a touch-screen panadapter display. Eric also talked about the KPA 500 solid state amplifier that offers direct control via any of the K-line radios. They also offer a full legal-limit KPA 1500 solid state amplifier, as well. Eric demonstrated the K4-0 remote head that is in beta testing, offering direct control of a host K4 via the internet. He said they hope to have the K4-0 available by Hamvention in May. He also talked about the KH1 CW only handheld transceiver. Eric entertained questions and comments from those present and was very accommodating in his talk.

The meeting adjourned around 9:00 pm.

Ham Radio News:

BOB BEGEMAN, W9KVK - SK

Bob Begeman, W9KVK passed away on Christmas Day. Bob was a long-time IRC member, a member of ARRL for over 60 years, and a Volunteer Examiner (VE), participating in around 300 testing sessions. Bob turned 100 on August 18 of last year.

Bob was drafted into the Navy’s Electronic Technician Program in 1943. He worked as an Electronic Technician on the attack transport USS George Clymer (APA 27) which was the flag ship scheduled to be part of the invasion fleet on Japan in November 1945. Luckily for Bob, WWII ended in August of 1945 and he was part of a landing party that disassembled a Japanese cave radio station.
