Highlights from the March Meeting:

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by Club President David Spoelstra, N9KT. There were 39 in attendance. There were several guests and first time attendees present. Recent upgrades included Bryce Wolf, AD9GG and Bendan O'Donnell, AD9GI. David reminded those in attendance of the next W9JP POTA operating event in the USS Indianapolis replica Radio Room inside the Indiana War Memorial, on Saturday, March 22. From the floor, Steve Wendt, KB9RDS announced that the estate of Fred Duncan, KB9FLB/SK donated a 40 foot tower and rotor to Salvation Army for their use with the W9JP station.

Next, David introduced the presenter for the evening, club member Mike Sercer, WA9FDO to talk about the Armed Forces Radio and Television Service. The service began in 1941. Before that, there was no VOA (Voice of America) or any other broadcasting for overseas servicemen, just a little bit of shortwave available. So some soldiers in Europe decided to start their own radio station. "Mail Call" was one of the first popular programs—included "Who's on First". The programs were recorded on disc and shipped around the world to different broadcast stations. Mike's presentation went through several notable events in WW2 and the fact that AFRS followed front line

activity. Of course, who can forget “Goooooooooooo morning, Vietnam!” , the popular Robin Williams film that featured Armed Forces Radio broadcasters.

At the end of Mike’s presentation, Bryce Wolf, AD9GG won the \$25 DX Engineering gift certificate.

W9WIN LINKED REPEATER SYSTEM GOING AWAY

Citing increasing costs and aging equipment, primary owner and operator of the W9WIN linked repeater system, Mike Poe, KB9SGN notified key users that the system, based in Bloomington, with coverage of a good part of the state south and west of Indianapolis, will be essentially shut down as of the end of March. At that time, the Bloomington repeater on 443.775 will be taken off the air. Mike stated that the other repeaters that he owns will be taken down by the end of the year. In Indianapolis, speculation is that the 444.325 repeater will remain on the air for the time being, but will be a stand-alone repeater, not linked to any others. Some of the repeaters that are part of the W9WIN system are owned and operated by others, and the future of those repeaters is uncertain.

In Mike's email, he stated that, "It was a good run for over 25 years, everyone should be proud of what was accomplished." At one point, there were 12 repeaters linked full-time via RF links, with a few others capable of being linked as needed.

Since May of 2021, the W9WIN system has been the home of the "Welcome (to Amateur Radio) Net", partly sponsored by the Indianapolis Radio Club. The Welcome Net served as a great tool to help new hams get comfortable operating their equipment, with many of the new hams taking roles on the Welcome Net as Net Controllers and Loggers. The future of the Welcome Net is uncertain. Chances are it will continue on more localized repeater systems once new homes are found.

Thanks to Mike and the other repeater owners that have been part of the W9WIN system. This should serve as a good reminder to us, as repeater users, to support the owners/operators of the repeaters we use.

INDIANA QSO PARTY COMING UP MAY 3

The 2025 Indiana QSO Party is coming up Saturday, May 3, running from 11:00 am to 11:00 pm, Indianapolis time. This is a great time to get on the air, because everyone will be looking for Indiana stations. Several plaques and certificates are available for many categories for both in-state and out-of-state stations. Once again this year, there will be 10 “rare” counties (Brown, Cass, Clinton, Wabash, White, Morgan, Shelby, Miami, Carroll, and Switzerland) that will qualify for additional plaques. From the March, 1965 *Amateuer*:

LOOK--UP IN THE SKY!

Launch time for Oscar III, the amateur radio repeater satellite, is getting near, reports Don Miller, W9NTP. He says orbit times will be given on WBRI, 1500 kc., at 4:30 pm daily beginning as soon as possible after the launch date. Orbit information also will be transmitted on 147.3 mc. FM. If you can't get either, call Gil Curtis, WA9GEU. The Indianapolis area TV experiment planned for use with Oscar III was described in February, 1965, QST, page 20.
