### **Highlights from the September Meeting:**

The meeting was called to order at 7:30 pm by IRC President, David Spoelstra, N9KT. David started with self-introductions. There were 36 in attendance. David reviewed the August club POTA event and went over the upcoming September POTA event [**details in this newsletter**]. There was discussion following up on the recent on-line discussions regarding possible new Amateur Radio license plates in Indiana. K9RU said the current arrangement of the \$8 extra charge dates back to the early 1950s. If we want a new plate, the cost would be around \$95 extra per plate, after paying to have the plates made.

Next, David introduced the evening's presenters, Jim Brown, W0RLD and Kyle Bandy, KC9GLR. Jim showed some and explained some things he has printed for the hobby. Kyle talked about CW key designs available on-line at the Thingiverse website (<https://www.thingiverse.com/>). Kyle went over some of the basics that are required to get into 3D printing, such as a printer, filament, and a design file (.stl). Jim talked about how the printer and computer interoperate.

Kyle and Jim talked about different software options. [TinkerCAD](#) is a good, free software option for designing items to print. Once a design is made, it has to be run through “slicer” software, which interprets the design into commands the printer uses. Filament materials were discussed. PLA is the cheapest and best for proto-typing designs. PTEG is more expensive, but more durable and a better option for items used outdoors. There are other types of filament, but some require different print heads and higher temperature. A consideration when selecting filament for antenna projects is how they interact with RF. A major consideration when thinking of printer location is ventilation because some filament types produce noxious fumes during printing.

Brands of printers was discussed. [Crealitiy](#) has a good relatively low-cost line, but also has limited support. [Prusa](#) is a good mid-cost option with several form factors and offering great support with updates often. There are lots of good support groups on-line. “Beginner” 3D printers can be had for \$200 to \$300. There are numerous vendors for 3D printers and supplies, such as Amazon, Micro-Center, and New Egg. [3DFuel](#) is a good source for filament. Jim and Kyle discussed necessary tools, with a micrometer and metric tape measure being top on the list. Isopropyl alcohol of 80% or higher strength is needed for cleaning the print head. There were several good questions and suggestions from those present.

Bryce, N9WF won the drawing for the \$25 DX Engineering gift certificate. The meeting adjourned at 8:56 pm.

### **AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER W9JP POTA RE-CAPS**

On Saturday, August 23, the Indianapolis Radio Club held a club Parks on the Air (POTA) operating event at Fort Harrison State Park. It was a nice day in the park, with temperatures in the lower 80s. ## **OCTOBER 25 IS THE NEXT CLUB POTA EVENT**

The next Indianapolis Radio Club Parks on the Air (POTA) operating event will be Saturday, October 25 at Fort Harrison State Park. We will plan to be on the air by noon with 2 HF stations. We will be set up at our normal spot, in front of the Visitor Center. If you have heard of the POTA program, but not been able to take part, this is your chance! Even if you're not licensed for HF, there will be control operators on site to help get you on the air. Both radios will have 2 positions, one for the operator and one for a logger, in case you need help logging. As usual, we will be using the club's callsign of W9JP, but if you're registered with the POTA system, you will get credit for the QSOs you make. So, if you're new to HF or POTA, or even if you're an experienced operator, stop by on October 25. We'll try to make sure the new operators get a chance to get on the air, but with 2 radios, anyone that wants to get on should be able to.

This event is open to everyone, **YOU DON'T HAVE TO BE A MEMBER OF THE IRC** to attend. As usual, we will have coffee, donuts, and water available for refreshments. Even if you don't want to operate, just stop on by to chat with everyone.

### Signals from the Past:

**From the September, 1960 *Amatewer*:**

#### OFFICIAL BULLETIN 760

FCC continues to cite amateurs for radiation of harmonics from amateur stations in frequency ranges outside the amateur bands. Friendly ARRL Official Observer reports still continue to be sent out for the FCC violations. Amateurs, especially those newly licensed, are urged to check to make sure their transmitters and antennas are radiating at the desired frequency, rather than at any harmonic. Consult Chapter 23 of the Amateur Radio Handbook for assistance in curbing harmonics.
